Manitou Springs Economic Development Council Offers Mr. Clucky Relocation Package

Manitou Springs, Colorado – Officials of the Manitou Springs Economic Development Council in Colorado have developed a full relocation package in response to the plight of Mr. Clucky of Miami Beach, Florida. Mr. Clucky and his girlfriend, Wallflower are being offered first class accommodations at a location bordering Garden of the Gods Park in the shadow of the nationally recognized mountain, Pikes Peak.

“We were distressed to hear that Mr. Clucky, a favorite to tourists at Miami Beach would be evicted by the town due to noise and code complaints,” stated Kitty Clemens, economic development director. “Our community has a long history of being all inclusive when it comes to chickens and roosters. In fact, the Reverend David Hunting, past Chairman of the board, credits the roosters living next to his mountainside cabin as a joyful addition to the community.”

Clemens called together a relocation team in quick response to news reports of the impending eviction of Mr. Clucky and Wallflower. Reverend Hunting felt it was the community’s mission to offer shelter reciting the mission of the Community Congregational Church – “No matter who you are or where you are on life’s journey, you are welcome here.” Chairman of the board, Tim Haas offered a permanent residence for Clucky and Wallflower. “We have 16 acres, so carving out a location for Mr. Clucky’s new living quarters is not a problem,” stated Haas.

The celebrity rooster and Miami Beach tourist favorite has been under fire after neighbors complained that he was nuisance and against code in Miami Dade County. When loss of his hearing was announced in the news, Manitou Springs, a small fun loving tourist town of 5000, known for its quirky events, natural

beauty and eclectic artistic population jumped into action. Manitou Springs was once home to Homer the duck. A rare female buck crest duck that won national acclaim when a neighbor filed a lawsuit over her quacking. Homer prevailed and lived in Manitou Springs until she fell victim to her over-amorous partner, Gerard.

“The economic development council conducts recruitment and retention activities, stated Clemens. Mr. Clucky’s plight reminded us of our beloved Homer. We believe that Clucky and Wallflower represent the embodiment of the spirit of Homer and Manitou Springs. The EDC stands prepared to provide a relocation package for the pair”.
